10 Reasons Why You Should Be A Missionary

Recently I read an article written by Rodney Pennigton with (OMF) who serves as Vice President for Mobilization and former missionary to Thailand. In his article Rodney lays out 10 reasons why people pass on the missionary life, and 10 reasons why cross-cultural missions still works today. His answers were insightful and I thought I'd pass this information along because each of us at one time or another have wondered why we continue to send missionaries to the field. Also, it is our ministry privilege to encourage others who might be considering full time mission's work and this information would prove most helpful as they consider that calling. (Answers #5 & #8 rocked me!)

1. Learning to live in a new culture.

It is true that living in a new culture can be incredibly stressful. However, it's also enriching as you experience the joys of cross-cultural work and get to see the diversity God created in humanity. Throughout scripture you will find God sending his messengers of truth into new cultures (Abraham, Joseph, Daniel, Peter, Paul). It was never easy, but God has always desired to reach the nations through his children. (Psalm 67).

2. Learning a new language.

The time, energy and stress that comes with learning a new language can be quite draining. However, it is a time-proven gift for those willing to take on such a task. Learning a new language enables you to build deep relationships with people as you communicate God's truth in words they understand. Think about it: we love to hear God's word in our language, don't we? Why would it be any different for others?

3. Giving up comforts.

Throughout much of the world, the true god of our lives can be found in our comforts—things like sports, TV, surfing the Internet or new toys. Comforts are not necessarily bad things. However, when they replace the joy, excitement, time and sacrifice that we have for God, they become the real god of our lives. Jesus himself didn't live in what most of us would call a "comfort zone" (Isa. 53; Luke 9:58), nor did his disciples or the early church.



4. Living on support.

Many Christians would say that they want to serve God, but support raising ... no thanks. Truth is, support raising is difficult and it doesn't get any easier. But there is truly something special about learning to place your wholehearted trust in God for your daily needs and watching how he provides. Not to mention that raising financial support for ministry work has a biblical foundation. The apostle Paul had no problem asking the church to fund his work, even as he trusted God to meet his every need (Rom. 15:24; 2 Cor. 8:1-5; Gal. 6:10).



5. Meeting your community's needs.

Yes, there are many needs in our own backyards that are not being met. Christians would do well to address them. However, are our own needs greater than those in a foreign land? When did Christ ever teach us to focus on our own needs, desires, longings or really anything that isn't driven first by the will of God? Of the \$700 billion given to Christian causes worldwide every year, 96.8 percent goes to the local church, 2.9 percent is used for home missions in the same Christian nation and 0.3 percent is spent going to unevangelized non-Christian people. Even less (0.06 percent) goes toward the unreached. We need to address this imbalance and recognize that God desires for BOTH our local and global communities to hear the gospel.



6. Family and friends

What greater call for celebration than lives being radically changed by the Holy Spirit and lived out faithfully no matter where that might take them? Leaving our family and friends or giving our children over to the will of God isn't easy and never will be. However, God is great and he promises to bless us through the sacrifices we offer before his throne. Trust in God's will and his alone.

7. Time

Why you should be a missionary: Imagine sitting in church and suddenly hearing the voice of God saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then what? Does everyone in the room sit there quietly, thinking they don't have the time? Maybe some start volunteering that one "radical" in the congregation because he or she doesn't quite "fit in." Maybe people start saying, "First, let me go and ____" (Matt. 8:21) or find they can't give up their possessions (Matt. 19:21-22). Our time on earth is limited. How great is it for those who say "Here am I, send me," and then go out and spend their time as though it really belongs to God?

8. Are missionaries needed anymore?

Unreached people groups, which are populations with less than 2 percent evangelical Christian witness, make up 42.2 percent of the world's population (3.11 billion people).¹ Many of us forget that there was a time when our own countries and people were without the truth of Christ. We are so used to the blessing of having the gospel abundantly available to us on TV, the radio and weekly church meetings. But this reality doesn't exist for billions around the world. The Apostle Paul once asked some important questions that the church must continue to ask and answer to this day such as, "How can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?" (Rom. 10:14-15).

9. Living with risk, trials or persecution.

Risk is a part of everyone's life. For the Christian, risk, trials and persecution should be expected from time to time. The Bible tells us that people will insult us and that persecution will come (Matt.5:11; 24:9) and that the cost of discipleship is great (Luke 9:23-26). However, the Bible also promises that God's children will be looked after and that he has a great plan for all who follow his ways (Jer. 29:11; Matt. 11:28-29; Phil. 4:19).

10. Matthew 28:18-20.

If the final commandment of the one whom Christians call the Lord and Savior of the world was to "go and make disciples of all nations," don't you think that should be a high priority within the church? It's true that not everyone is going to serve in a foreign land, but all are called to be a part of the Great Commission: (Matt 28:18-20).

Church Spotlight on 2:TEN Church

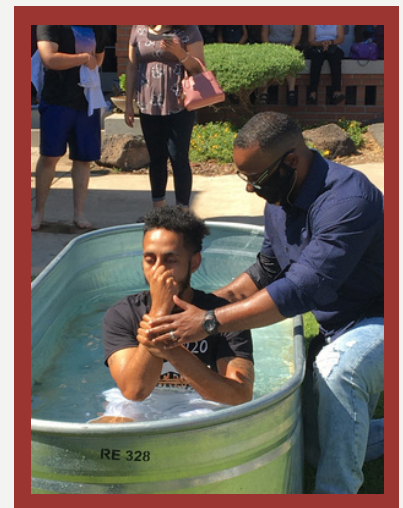
The purpose of the Church is simple: Help others discover their purpose in life and walk with them in accomplishing it. Both Antione and Amanda know that the only way that a person can discover their purpose, is to first accept Christ in their heart as both Lord and Savior.

That is why 2:TEN Church was born. 2:TEN Church gets its name from Ephesians 2:10, where the Bible reads: *"For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago."* (Ephesians 2:10 NLT)



2:TEN Church was approved by the Assemblies of God on May 28th, 2020. Since then, Pastor's Antione & Amanda have been blessed to lead a growing congregation that has been able to serve 26 families, with a total of over 75 people, both in person and online. Over the course of this last year, 2:TEN Church has been able to see 10 decisions for Christ and 10 baptisms. 2:TEN has also been able to donate over 600 pairs of socks and thereby bless the men and women of Arizona Teen Challenge and Casa Fenix.

Currently, 2:TEN Church is developing their discipleship process to ensure that people will have a solid biblical foundation. They are also looking to develop a leadership team to serve in the youth and children's ministry (Generation 2:TEN). 2:TEN is also looking to transition to a permanent location where they can more effectively serve the community that the Holy Spirit has placed on their heart.



Pastor Antione and Amanda have been married for 15 years. They have a blended family with three children: Kiara, Antione “AJ”, & Aliyah. They believe our greatest witness to our personal relationship with Jesus Christ is our pursuit and discovery of God’s plan for our lives, while walking in relationship and sharing life with others.



Antione gained experience by serving in an organization that provided behavioral health services for at-risk youth. Utilizing his skills to grow and develop others, he eventually served as the Vice President of the organization.

Antione & Amanda co-founded Directing Footsteps LLC. Through Directing Footsteps, the Anderson’s are able to provide personal coaching (helping others discover potential and accomplish goals) and business consulting (helping business owners with growth and development strategies, while improving operations to increase efficiencies and revenues).

During this time, the Anderson’s became committed members of a local church, where they were able to serve for over 10 years. Antione served in a variety of roles including: Board Trustee, Celebrate Recovery Ministry Leader, Leadership Development Team, Pastoral Executive Team, and Executive Minister. Amanda served in the Children’s Ministry, while pursuing a career in child development. Additionally, she was the Director of a Daycare Center and started her own business called Abba’s Little Treasures, LLC.

Beyond serving in the local church, Antione was blessed to have authored and published two books: *Bargain Basement Jesus: The Cost of Following* (2015); and *Prepared: Journey to Fulfill Your Destiny* (2019). These books opened the opportunity to travel nationally and abroad to preach, teach, and encourage others to fulfil the divine calling that God has for individuals.



Antione and Amanda truly believe that God created each of us on purpose. So, in the fall of 2019 the Holy Spirit spoke to both Antione and Amanda, instructing them that it was time to step out and plant 2:TEN Church. They are so thankful for all that God has been doing and look forward to all that is yet to come!

NOTE TO SELF...



DON'T WALK ALONE

"Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work." - Ecclesiastes 4:9

Like you, I can identify many great seasons of ministry and then a few that I would just as soon never think about again. Actually, there are those I must forget in order to not get stuck there and miss out on what good things God has for the future.

I can reflect on two extremely difficult seasons of my life and ministry. The first I walked through virtually alone, aside of my dear wife. The second I had three pastors to talk and pray with on a weekly basis—and what a difference it made!

GOD NEVER INTENDED FOR US TO WALK ALONE...PERIOD.

One of His earliest decrees about man was that it was not good for him to walk this life in isolation; and God took significant action to remedy the situation! (Gen. 2:18) Yet, so often as pastors, we choose to do just that: walk it out on our own. Why do we do that? What is it about us that our first inclination is isolation?

Many factors lend to this seclusion of self: pride, fear, embarrassment, self-reliance. Yet, none of these are God's choice for us. It may sound trite, but walking alone only fosters loneliness. Loneliness plagues ministry today. Most pastors feel they do not have anyone to turn to for their deepest personal and ministry struggles.

Several years ago, I discovered a simple life-giving discipline. I began praying with a pastor friend for just 15 minutes every week. I barely knew him when we began, but we are close friends today. Can you spare 15 minutes in your week? Do you know just one other pastor that might need to pray with someone? I'm sure you can and do; and I urge you to not walk alone for one more season of your life and ministry!

The 15-Minute Pastor-to-Pastor Prayer Time

- Find another pastor willing to commit to a 15-minute weekly call.
- Find a slot in your week that works for both of you.
- When you call, talk a little “life” and then, swap prayer needs.
- Take turns praying for one another.
- Believe God is going to answer your prayers!

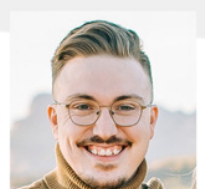
