With the start up of school season, my heart is burdened for our kids and what they are being taught, from Pre-K up through High School. Transgender thinking is being crammed down our throats, whether it be television commercials, text books, some teachers themselves, and all social media. I have a grandson still in high school, and I pray over him daily. Oh God, cover the hearts and minds of our children, and our young people. Another reason I hold close to my heart the ministry of our summer camp season. Parents, know what your children are being taught. Read their textbooks. Know what their teachers are telling them. Be alert, be on guard, and cover your children daily with the blood of Jesus in prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit.



### A PERMANENT HOME FOR DESERT SPRINGS CHURCH - GILBERT CAMPUS





#### FINDING THE PERFECT HOME

In the Summer of 2020, God placed a word in Pastor Lynette's heart to look into the church finding a permanent home in one of the buildings of the many closing businesses around. Once they began to look with a broker, they were met with many "no thank you's". In December of 2020, a member of their campus, Christina Vincent, stopped by the Goodwill on the corner of Lindsay and Warner in Gilbert. After overhearing a conversation about the closing of that location, confirmation from the manager, and confirmation from the Lord – she contacted Pastors Bryan and Lynette.

#### THE VERY BEGINNING

The Gilbert Campus of Desert Springs Church originally launched in the fall of 2019 at Cooley Middle School - the first organic church campus plant of Desert Springs Church in Chandler. The Gilbert Campus is led by a team of faithful believers and Campus Pastors Bryan and Lynette Durrett.





#### HOW IT HAPPENED

Their broker set up an appointment and for the first time, he had heard no closed doors to the prospect of a church using the building. When the team met with the owner, it was discovered that the owner, Mr. Borros felt this was an open door for the church and he was an Ordained Minister with the International Assemblies of God in Romania.

As their next meetings were delayed due to Mr. Borros and others in the church suffering with Covid, they were told that Mr. Borros received a vision from the Lord and heard "you need to build that church". Once Mr. Borros recovered, he made an offer to the Gilbert Team that was too good to not move forward.

Construction began later that summer and after many delays due to labor & supply issues, their first service in the building was March 13th, 2022. Their Grand Opening was earlier this year on April 3rd with 195 in attendance!

We are celebrating with Desert Springs Church - Gilbert Campus that they are in a permanent home and believe that God will continue to use them to reach the Gilbert Community!






### Reframe (Reckon) Your Life

Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead...
- Philippians 3:13b

Our summer Pastors' Zoom calls are really enjoying walking through "Winning the War In Your Mind" (2021) by Craig Groeschel. This influential pastor candidly shares his own challenges with his thoughts and beliefs about himself and provides great information on how to win that seat of much spiritual warfare - the human mind.



One of the weekly discussions was on the subject of reframing our thoughts. He described it as "when we learn to identify and correct irrational thinking...and not hang on to old perceptions that have worked against us" (pg. 120). Certainly pastoral ministry provides all kinds of mine fields in our thoughts that we must navigate and this tool is critical to us maintaining the right perspective toward situations and people. Groeschel challenges us to reflect back to times when God did not answer our prayers the way we had hoped He would and how in the end, it worked out to our benefit. Such reflection reminds us that we can "reframe" even the most difficult of life's events and believe God is working them out for His purpose and our good (Romans 8:28).

Dr. Donald Lichi of Emerge Ministries taught this as the "reckoning" principle. He sees one of God's great gifts as our ability to consider our past, present, and futures in this way. No matter what the situation is, we can rapidly compare these three timeframes in our minds...for example, the past with our future, or the present with our past, or the future in light of our present. This shifting of timeframes (again) helps us keep perspective. The apostle Paul did this in the opening chapter of Philippians as he penned his words from a prison cell and of course, again in that classic moment of chapter three, "forgetting what is behind (past), I strain (present) toward what is ahead (future)...". What a great perspective!

Pastors, I encourage you to get Groeschel's book. The tools provided help us steward our minds for God's glory. I would love to share more with you about this life-giving subject.

#### TIPS FOR REFRAMING/RECKONING:

- Reflect on when God didn't answer your prayers the way you wanted and it turned out for your good.
- Take a current challenge you are facing and reckon it in light of God's past faithfulness, His current presence with you, and hope for your future in Him.
