Introducing our newest AZ Ministry Network missionary associates, Bradley & Nichole Green:

Hello! We are Bradley and Nichole Green and we have been appointed as Missionary Associates to the unreached people of Central Eurasia. For the past 4 years we have been US missionaries to college campuses through Chi Alpha but after 2 years of prayer and seeking the Lord we felt God strongly calling us to World Missions. We saw firsthand the incredible lack of access our friends in Eurasia have to the Gospel.



97% of the population of Central Eurasia is still unreached and the country we will be serving contains over 50 unreached people groups.

Our vision is to see a church planting movement among the people of Eurasia so that generations can have the same access and blessings of the Good News of Jesus that we are so fortunate to have in America.

We will be joining a church planting team in a large city full of universities where we will be attending language school to better contextualize the gospel to locals and where we have greater opportunity to reach the younger generation. They are beginning to walk away from the religious strongholds of Islam and start seeking truth and relationship with Jesus. We are looking forward to using our experience in college ministry to meet the demand of hundreds of locals who have signed up to receive New Testaments and want to start meeting to talk about Jesus. Working together, we believe we will see this ancient and influential region of the world as a pillar of the Church, giving glory to King Jesus once again.

It's our desire to whole-heartedly invest in this young couple and propel them forward in the call of God on their lives. They are available for services, conversations, coffee, etc. and would welcome every opportunity to share with you, your missions board, and of course, your church. Let's get behind them and see what God can do!

Tim & Janela Meacham (Russia) are also currently itinerating and looking to connect with pastors and churches. If you have not yet had the opportunity to meet with them or have them share in your church, please do so. Tim and Janela have rich history here in Arizona and we're thrilled to call them "our own."


Utilizing Gifts and Talents: Everyone Has a Role







Women have already shared stories of how the Spirit moved, how God spoke through our fantastic speakers, and how much fun they had connecting with likeminded women who share their faith and values.



National Speed the Light Day October 15, 2023

WE ARE BELIEVING FOR A RECORD-BREAKING OFFERING!

We are going ALL IN to spread the gospel through *Speed the Light* in East Africa in 2023. In February, 50 students responded to the call of God on our regional tour to be a missionary, and over \$400,000 was promised in faith to Speed the Light in 2023. We've never given with that kind of generosity in one year, but we see this as a divine invitation to chase that goal as a leadership team personally and publicly. If all of our 200+ churches gave \$2,000 to STL by the end of this year, we would surpass this faith promise! We know this would be a miracle, so we're asking you to join us in this BOLD prayer and effort to be ALL IN.

We've already given nearly \$100,000 this year, but we still have over \$200,000 in STL projects on our list. These are our US and World Missionaries waiting on the resources from our churches. What could happen if we cleared our entire project list by the end of the year and propelled the gospel forward in this way!?

At Arizona Youth Convention October 27th and 28th, we will be highlighting the ministry of Scott and Sarah Berkey in East Africa. The Berkey's will be with us for all of our students and churches to witness a miracle offering. We are putting our best plan before the Lord, asking His blessing on our missions strategy. We can already see His hand at work! *WorldServe International* partners have committed that every dollar given through *Speed the Light* from now to the end of the year will be matched! These are businesses and athletes like Myles Garrett (Cleveland Browns) and Malcom Brogden (Boston Celtics) who've heard what Arizona students are sacrificing, and committed to match their giving! This means that if we gave only \$150,000 by the end of this year, we would meet our faith promise. I know it's ambitious, but we believe ALL things are possible with God. To break it down, the cost for one well in Kenya is \$50,000. If one church gave \$25,000, through matching funds, that's one community receiving a sustainable water source and hope for another generation knowing Christ. If five churches have \$5,000, together that's one well for another community transformed with a compassionate demonstration of the gospel. I believe with God's help, we can do this!

Will you consider preparing your students and church for National STL Day on October 15 (or a day of your choosing), and join us in a special offering in our Youth Convention missions service on Saturday, October 28th? We have from now to the end of the year to send our best for 2023.
