

COMPELLED

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor!"

Isaiah 61:1-2

From Isaiah's bold words comes our AG World Missions' 2020 theme – COMPELLED! We are compelled by scripture to carry the saving message of Jesus to every corner of the world, with the purpose of reaching of every man, woman and child.

Recently, I was once again reminded of the billions who are still sitting in darkness waiting to see Christ's light. Please allow me to share those stats from each continent of the world.

Asia Pacific 883,421,000

Northern Asia 1,320,793,000

Eurasia 2,654,733,000

Africa 899,049,000

Europe 514,647,000

Latin America 530,728,000

In total, not including North America, there are **6,803,371,000 UNSAVED PEOPLE**. Almost seven billion people do not know Jesus. Friends, we must be compelled to reach them.

This task is enormous and will require all of us to succeed. Of course Jesus knew this, which is why He spent His entire ministry training His disciples to multiply themselves in order to accomplish the

mission. As you move into the book of Acts you find the names of roughly 60 believers, but often we focus on a few like Peter, Paul and John. But they are not the only the heroes God used to spread the gospel.

What about Matthias? What happened to him and the rest of the apostles? What about Timothy, Aquila, Priscilla, Agabus, Apollos and the daughters of Philip? What about the believers mentioned in Hebrews 11 who perished by the sword, lived in caves or were put in prison? Are they noteworthy to be mentioned by name and have their stories told?

The answer is an emphatic YES! The task will take all of us!

In order to accomplish the task I'd like to share a couple of highlights from our National AGWM executive director, Greg Mundis. He gives three important strategies to move the mission forward:

1. Start where you are. Let go of where you think you should be.

So often we compare ourselves with others in the area of numbers. I remember when we came to Harvest Church 20 years ago I looked at the missions giving per church and found our church was dead last. Initially, I thought, "We'll never give amounts like other large churches." Fortunately, I also realized that giving to missions is not a competition but a matter of respect and love for the Father's heart. Fellow ministers, it doesn't matter where you are today or where you think you should be, what matters most is opening your heart to do something with a spirit of generosity. Start where you're at and witness God placing His favor on your church.

Use what you have. Don't make excuses for what you don't have.

The number #1 killer of missions momentum is the statement, "If only we had..." I often hear pastors say, "If only we had a bigger church we could give more to missions." Or "If only I had someone on staff that would oversee missions." Or, "If only we had a wealthy person in our church, we could do more for missions." Might I remind you that Jesus only had two fish and five loaves when He performed the miracle of feeding the five thousand? And I can almost hear you saying, "That's true, but I'm not Jesus." You're right! You're not Jesus, but I would also remind you that you have miracle-working Holy Spirit power available to you.

If you would release God's creativity, take a risk and climb out of the boat, you'd be amazed at what God would be willing to do through your church, regardless of side. When Sue and I came to Harvest Church one of the first things we did was add five missionaries to our missions' budget. Did we have the finances? No! But we refused to use excuses and took a risk. And now, twenty years later, Harvest supports over 100 missionaries at home and abroad. Miracles are possible if you don't make excuses.

3. Do what you can. Believe God will do what you can't.

When we do our part, using what God has placed in our hands, He can multiply it and work miracles. Only God can change lives; we are merely His conduits. This is why we depend on prayer. J. Sidlow Baxter said people "are helpless against our prayers." Prayers outlive our time on earth, creating a ripple effect into the future. When we pray, God moves. He multiplies the fish and loaves. He heals the blind and lame. He protects and guides our steps. Prayer is our participation in the miracle work of God.

As we enter this new year and decade, let me challenge you with the words of the Apostle Paul, "This one thing I do ..." Philippians 3:13 Make the most of your 24-hour day. Avoid distractions and run your race in such a way as to gain the prize. The Great Commission requires all of us to remain focused on our primary calling: bringing the message of Christ to

this hurting world. The task will take all of us!

On our recent network tour, our team shared some thoughts with you on the subject of your health. One way to consider how God designed us is through what is known as the "P.I.E.S.S."; that we are physical, intellectual, emotional, social, and spiritual. As these aspects of our humanness reflect how incredibly complex we each are, they also remind us that God expects us to steward each in a manner glorifying to Him! So, I would like to talk to you a bit about each of these over the next few months...

GOD MADE YOU PHYSICAL. Think of all the verses of Scripture that emphasize the place, usefulness, and responsibility our bodies play in relationship to God. God made us to be "body people"—made of the dust of the earth and inspiration of his breath—who would carry His Holy Spirit everywhere we go. Paul countered the Gnostic's view of the body by reminding the Corinthians that their bodies were the temple of the Holy Spirit. He also called the Romans to present their bodies as living sacrifices to the Lord. As well, spouses were to recognize their bodies belonged to one another in the bounds of holy marriage.

WE NEED A BETTER THEOLOGY OF THE BODY. I was struck when I heard Dr. Donald Lichi of Emerge Ministries make this statement years ago. It's true. We focus much teaching on the minds and hearts of our congregants, but seldom address their physical bodies. Do we believe God cares about our bodies? Do we believe He cares about what we do with our bodies? What does stewarding our bodies look like? Why does it even matter what we do with our bodies? How do the Old and New Testaments approach God's people in relation to their physical bodies? Theology is nothing unless it reaches the ears and hearts of our listeners. They need to hear from you on this subject.

THE PHYSICAL PART OF YOU IS NOT SOME PIECE BELONGING TO THE SPIRITUAL PART OF YOU. GOD OWNS THE WHOLE WORKS. SO LET PEOPLE SEE GOD IN AND 8 THROUGH YOUR BODY. - 1 CORINTHIANS 6:19, THE MESSAGE

WE NEED TO STEWARD OUR BODIES AS PASTORS/LEADERS. Think of the last time a leader you admired either grew sick or died in ministry. I recall when John Maxwell had heart problems years ago. I was saddened, concerned, and hoped he would not only receive great medical treatment, but also take steps to do all he could do to steward his heart well in the future! Pastor, your spirit will only take you as far as your body takes you. Paul did say that bodily exercise profits "some" or "little" (1 Tim 4:8). That small amount just might be what adds years of health and vitality to your life, your marriage, and yes, your ministry!

CONSIDER

- How are your eating habits?
- Do you exercise, workout, take walks, etc.?
- Have you considered the benefits of fasting occasionally?
- Do you have regular physical check-ups?
- Do you pay attention to 'warning signs' from your body?
- What kind of example are you to your flock in this area?

We believe God has great plans for the Intercultural Ministries Churches of the Arizona Network in 2020! Jesus said in Matthew 17:20, Because you have so little faith. Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.

Mustard seed faith is initially small and messy, just like the seed. Even though it starts small, it

can grow to impact power that moves mountains. A small faithfilled idea can birth change. Our prayer is for that impact to change neighborhoods and cities, which infers the lives of people and families are being transformed.



Tyrone and Amy Rinta, lead pastors at Bell Road Church in North Phoenix, felt God was planting that small mustard seed faith early in 2019 by intentionally focusing on a neighborhood near their church. After prayer and discussion with leaders, they took the giant step by adding a Spanish church service called Iglesia Bell Road Church. They now have two Sunday services, one in English and one in Spanish.

At the same time, God was speaking to church board member, Miguel Saenz, to get his ministerial credentials through Arizona School of Ministry. Miguel had forgotten much of the Spanish language, but God started to prepare him. After

strategizing and a major outreach to the Palomino Park Neighborhood, Pastor Miguel and his wife, Patricia, started a Spanish speaking service during the Easter season. Today, a vibrant and healthy Spanish congregation is impacting the neighborhood of Palomino. They are heading into other parts of the city declaring that mountains move in Jesus' name. Hispanic people are the largest demographic in the north Phoenix area of the Bell Road Church. Because of their mustard seed faith, both Spanish and English services have grown, seeing wonderful growth in youth and children's ministry as both churches come together on Sunday morning.
