

In recent weeks, we have lost precious men, people who influenced the Kingdom of God in so many ways:





Please allow me to introduce our newest fully appointed missionary. Her name is Marisa M. and she recently finished a missionary associate assignment and has now been given clearance to itinerate as one of our Arizona Network General Appointed missionaries. Please take the time to read at Marisa shares her heart and plan to reach the people of Saudi Arabia.

Marisa writes, "I first felt called to Saudi Arabia when I was 14 years old. Throughout my life, God has been faithful to open door after amazing door—from learning Arabic with an Arab family in my tiny New Mexico hometown, to going overseas and leading

bible studies with seekers. I just completed 2 years in Jordan with Live Dead, an initiative within Assemblies of God World Missions (AGWM) to plant churches among unreached people groups in teams. I am now launching onto the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia Church Planting team led by Dick and Jenn Brogden."



"The movement happening in Saudi is exciting! The church is being planted and the harvest is ready. On a monthly basis, our team is seeing seekers come to faith, get discipled, and even get baptized! I have witnessed first-hand what is happening on the ground, and even 3 years ago could not have imagined that this was possible! God has already miraculously provided a 5-year visa for me to go, it is merely a matter of developing the prayer and financial partnerships to be able to get on the ground. As my visa has already begun, I have a sense of urgency to get back to my team to join the work at hand."

"I grew up in New Mexico, completed my degree at SAGU in Texas, and began my career in Arizona. The Southwest is my home and Arizona is my home network. I have a passion for mobilization and discipleship! I see my time in the states as a unique opportunity to challenge others of all ages to join us in the harvest field. My heart is to be a blessing to AZ churches!"

"I am grateful for the Arizona Network and would be honored to partner with you and your church as we seek 'His Kingdom come and His will be done' in Saudi Arabia. Network Family, would you be so kind to pray for Marisa as she itinerates and open a door of ministry in your church? And as always, thank you for your generosity to all our Arizona Network missionaries.







In November, Norman and Cheryl Knoodle (Field Missionaries with Church Mobilization/MAPS) and the RV Ministry Volunteers were asked to come to First Assembly of God in Quartzsite AZ. They were there to remodel the church after a major water leak had taken place. The church had been without a pastor for over two years and due to some unfortunate situations, the church had been closed since February 2020.

The damage included bathrooms, kitchen cabinets, church flooring, drywall, and the fellowship hall. Norm and Cheryl Knoodle arrived in Quartzsite AZ, on November 18 along with two RV Volunteer Units. Once repairs had started it was decided to have the first service on November 22. That first Sunday there were 17 people in attendance including people from the community that had stopped by that week to see what was happening.

By the first of December, they had three more RV couples arrive to help them. The demo was now done and they began the transformation process. For the month of December, they worked hard getting the walls drywalled, taped, and textured, kitchen cabinets built, bathroom and kitchen plumbing done, and a new platform built. 8



All the while they continued to have services and God continued to grow His church. They never advertised that the Church was open. However, word got out that they were in the middle of the construction and that they were having services. God blessed and came in a special way. They were given food by the local food bank and they were able to feed their workers and the people in the community who came to their services. God was providing all they needed including more workers.

They had been praying for a pastor for this church. Every day, as a group, they had break time and every day they prayed for Quartzsite First Assembly of God, that God would bring a pastor and the congregation. It would take a very special pastor to come here and grow this church.

By now they had about 40-45 people attending on Sundays. God was growing His church and getting ready for the next step - a new shepherd for His church. Richard and Linda Freese felt God calling them to come and pastor the church and after much prayer and organization, they were introduced to the church on January 31 as the new pastor's to a congregation of 52 people that morning.





At this time, the church is within a week of a complete remodel of a damaged, closed building, including the parsonage and evangelist quarters. The church has been updated and almost completely repaired and remodeled, but the best thing is that the church has been opened back up with a new pastor. The theme in RV Ministry is "Building churches, Changing lives." They have watched God do so much to help them achieve so much for His kingdom. They feel privileged to be a part of Church Mobilization/MAPS and see God work miracles.





EMBRACE GOD IN THE DISCOMFORT

"...someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." - John 21:18 NIV

Many years ago God, through an interesting series of events, led me to a new theological concept termed "spiritual displacement." Henri Nouwen wrote of this and described it as what we experience when we leave the comfortable and go into a place outside our comfort zone.


Countless examples in our faith—from Scripture to Church history—illustrate this reality. Jesus was speaking to Peter in John 21, although Christ Himself is our chief example of someone who left the comfortable (heaven) to enter into the uncomfortable (earth) for God, His Father. You want to talk transitions, that was one serious transition!

As the Church enters 2021 it is filled with reminders of a new, uncomfortable place: Covid-19 prevails and the losses it has produced, election results and their fallout, partial attendance inperson and hopefully the rest online, and questions of what "the new normal" is looking to be, to name a few. In the midst of it all, God is still God. On His throne. Omnipotent. Aware. He just might even have known all of this was going to happen! (tongue embedded deeply in cheek)

God is looking for people that choose to be faith-filled in 2021. He knows this is uncomfortable for us, but seeks to lead us today as He did in early 2020. If God works all things together for our good, then what does He have in store for you and your church in 2021? It is time to not only embrace where we find ourselves in this new season, but to embrace what God is seeking to do in and through us in 2021, uncomfortable as it all may be. God is still at work!





Arizona Intercultural Ministries

Stress. Hopelessness. Crisis. Pandemic. For us as ministers, these things have the ability to enable us to pursue the heart of our Father in greater ways, which can accelerate change in our ministries. What might have taken years can become the new "normal" overnight. Instead of ministering to a church filled with God's faithful, we are ministering to more people that are fearfully looking for hope. Many of our Arizona ministers are using new and creative methods in their ministries. For this we are grateful. Yet the fundamentals are unchanging.

1. PEOPLE MUST BE ANCHORED TO THE WORD OF GOD
Without His Word there is no compass to the world's chaos! Let's have
action plans to read and study the Word of God individually and together.
We are grateful the Assemblies of God Bible Engagement Project is an

available tool at this time in history.

2. PEOPLE MUST PRAY

A resent discipline in many churches is committing January to a time of corporate prayer and fasting. God has used this in a great way. Let us develop ongoing moments to create a deeper commitment to prayer in our lives and the life of His Church. As D.L. Moody so eloquently proclaimed, "Every great movement of God can be traced back to a kneeling figure."

We continue to thank God for what He is accomplishing during this time! We have had more than 25 churches add new language specific churches or church services to their ministry. Churches like The River in Phoenix with pastors Tyrone and Amy Rinta, have a vision for Iglesia Agua en el Desierto, with pastor Miguel Saenz, the Spanish language service that partners in their church. This allows that church to cast a wider net in their community.
