As we enter 2022, I'm reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul, "Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. NOGALES SONORA MEXICO



THE LORD'S PLAN

In the midst of the ever-changing world,
Abundant Life Assembly in Nogales
encountered an opportunity for growth and
outreach beyond their four-walls and country.
The shutdown and closed borders brought
separation in the church family living in
Nogales, Sonora Mexico. In a moment of
helplessness, the Lord confirmed His plan for
Pastor David Lopez – a church plant in Nogales
Sonora Mexico.





In the early stages of the pandemic, Pastor David and Liz began to cross into Mexico each week to meet the congregants at a local park with devotionals and necessary groceries for the families. These visits quickly ignited the idea to launch a small group in a congregant's garage temporarily until the borders opened. This small group met weekly for a year. During this time, the church participated in outreaches during Christmas and the summer with VBS, reaching more than 150 children and youth. Many of these children gave their lives to Christ and others learned to pray for the first time!

As there were increasing opportunities for outreach, the need for a permanent place was so clear. The church began to pray and search to lease a building or purchase land to build on. As an answered prayer, we are excited to announce that a church building was purchased in the Fall of 2021!





The current state of the building is beyond salvage with water damage, mold, and buckling walls. There is progress being made, but the church is continuing to pray and believe for the provision of rebuilding. They are looking to raise \$50,000 to purchase materials to begin construction this winter.



Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance.

- James 1:2-3

As 2021 drew to a close, a ministry friend illustrated to me the importance of resiliency. Having suddenly lost his wife mid-year, he shared that in the midst of deep sorrow he has continually maintained a sense of gratitude for his 50+ years of marriage. He referenced his refusal to fall prey to the anger and bitterness he had witnessed at his church's grief ministry. Rather, he said he almost felt a sense of guilt for how content he is in this life-altering season.

Five years ago, I sat with a friend of mine, Al Ells, to talk through some life issues of my own. Midway through our conversation Al brought up the word resilience. He emphasized that God is continually using our circumstances as leaders to produce greater resiliency in our lives. In the book he was then writing on the subject, he states:

Resiliency is the necessary ingredient for overcoming the difficulties of life and leadership—and becoming better for having had those experiences (chapter one, The Resilient Leader, Alfred Ells, 2020).

Images of Moses, David, the O.T. prophets, Peter, and Paul spring to life in light of Oxford Dictionary's definition of resilience: "The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness." Certainly the Church's emergence from Covid invites us to this discussion. God wants to use current events to develop greater resiliency in us all and in our churches!

I challenge you to take this to the Lord in prayer as you enter another year of ministry. Resilience will be our focus in this month's annual Sectional Tour. As well, the new book offered in our upcoming lead pastor's zoom call groups will be on this muchneeded topic. I believe God is speaking a fresh word to us in reminder that He will is always continuing this work in our lives.

Tips for personal/ministry growth:

- Ponder the resilience God built in the lives of key characters in Scripture.
- Consider a sermon series on Resilience in 2022.
- Meditate upon key verses that reflect this truth (James 1, Romans 5).
- Reflect on one way God used your trials in 2021 to develop your resiliency.






WHAT A YEAR!


My prayer for this next year is to continue to see a healthy and thriving program in our Network marked by numerical and spiritual growth.

TEEN CHALLENGE OF ARIZONA

Sing to the Lord a new song, sing to the Lord all the earth. Psalm 96:1

a virtual tour of songs & stories

My name is Nick, and I am from the small town of Cleveland, TN. I came to Teen Challenge lost and broken, out of options and without hope.

I had struggled with addiction for many years. I tried everything, and nothing seemed to work. There were numerous rehabs, jail time, and no matter what, I could not shake the enemy's hold on my life.

Before coming into the program, I had found myself in serious trouble with the law. I was facing 16-24 years in prison for a high-level drug charge. I found myself alone and frustrated. I remember getting on my knees in my jail cell and crying out to God. I had known for a long time that God had a calling on my life.

I had grown up in a Christian household and had known God from a young age, or so I thought. I wanted to see the impossible, yet I couldn't see a way out of my situation. It wasn't until I found myself in such despair that I actually gained my faith.

Psalm 120:1 says, "I called to Jehovah in my distress, and He answered me." Still, to this day, I get goosebumps whenever I say or read that scripture. He rescued me!

I was able to come to Teen Challenge and get the healing that I needed, spiritual healing. I haven't looked back since. I still can't believe how far out of darkness God has brought me and, better yet, the intense amount of light that He has brought me into!



NICK'S STORY

I am now the Public Relations Representative here at the Tucson Men's Center. I have a wonderful relationship with my family and friends. I've been accepted back into school, where I will continue my education to become a psychologist.

THE STORY OF SHEALEN

My name is Shealen Goodman. I am 29 years old and recently graduated from Teen Challenge of Arizona's Home of Hope. I also live there with my son Thomas who is five years old. Before the Home of Hope, I was desperate, broken, lost, and hopeless. I felt trapped in my circumstances and in my head. The Home of Hope loved me back to life by showing me tough love; giving me guidance and structure. They surrounded me with the word of God, showing me how to have a relationship with Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

This program has given me a support system; a hope that I can overcome obstacles plus, the tools I needed to be a good mom for my son and to secure our future. I am so thankful for this ministry. They have literally given me a hope & a future.



I am not trapped, I am not alone, The Lord will never leave me nor forsake me. I plan to be an intern here. I trust my leaders for guidance. My prayer is that my internship brings hope for other women & children and provide guidance just as my leaders have done for me. Proverbs 3:5,6
