



Summit Church Celebrates Five Years





Recently, Summit Church in Anthem celebrated their five year anniversary as a church! Pastors Jeremy and Catie Naranjo have been in awe of God's faithfulness over the years.

Catie shares, "Church planting can feel very similar to having children and as you watch them grow, it's important to step back every once in a while and remember just how far they've come."

The sermon Jeremy shared on their Vision Sunday emphasized remembering how far they had come, but also talked about focusing on where they are going. To help the church remember back, they collected pictures for a photo display and gathered written stories for an online "memory wall." In the end, everyone left with giveaways and dessert, but the most important thing they took with them was faith for the years ahead.

Summit Church has a seen the value of faith and perseverance. For their first three years they met in an elementary school and are now renting two units within an industrial warehouse space. There is still much to be renovated in the building, many people to reach in their community and more ministry to be done, but they rejoice in the growth they have seen. The next steps for Summit Church are still being written, but God has given them a heart to support and plant churches, to raise up and train leaders, and to reach the hurting families in their community.

Summit Church praises God for the incredible team of leaders who serve on staff as bi-vocational ministers and the gifted volunteers He continues to send. Thank you for praying and believing with Summit Church that God will continue using them to build His kingdom in North Phoenix!













NOTE TO SELF... MIND THE MIND!

"The mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace." - Romans 8:6b

"The mind is a terrible thing to waste," the UNCF radio commercial said. One would think no pastor ever needs such a reminder, and yet, I recall a message by David Wilkerson years ago in which he confessed a season of just that in his own life. He felt God convict him of not stewarding his mind as he should.

Our minds are such an incredible gift from God. Can you imagine trying to "discharge all the duties" of a pastor (2 Tim 4:5) without a good mind; for that matter, without a clear mind, a creative mind, a guilt-free mind, a peaceful mind? Our minds are at the heart of everything we do in ministry. Yes, like the rest of the P.I.E.S.S. (physical, intellectual, emotional, social, & spiritual) view of our design, our intellect/minds must be stewarded so that we are our best for the Lord.

Four years of my time in Springfield were spent on the second floor of AGTS. I had always wanted to earn a Master's degree, but just never made the time. It was hard to juggle along with pastoring Central Assembly, but the rewards were much beyond what I had imagined! The reading, cohort discussions, and week-long tutelage by phenomenal professors stimulated thoughts I would never have experienced otherwise. I'm sure you have felt the same in your academic pursuits, or even just in experiencing a thought-provoking conference or seminar.

Let me just give you a few suggestions for your mind's sake:

Memorize Scripture – I mean, why not? Why wouldn't we as pastors discipline ourselves to keep memorizing the word through intentional meditation? I memorized the Sermon on the Mount years ago and quoted it to launch my sermon series. Last year, I committed to memory the lengthy St. Patrick's Breastplate Prayer and pray it every day. It's chuck-full of theology and truth, while asking for God's protection, wisdom, and guidance. Why not? Memorization is great work for the mind.

Do some metacognition – Slow down enough to think about what you are thinking about. It might surprise you where your mind spends most of its time. It is in this practice that we obey the commands we know so well, to: "take every thought captive" "be transformed by the renewing of your mind" & "as a man thinketh in his heart..."

Allow nothingness – Literally, provide your mind moments like when as a child you laid in the grass and watched the clouds move in the sky. Allow your mind to rest. Enjoy the desert or other aspects of Arizona creation. Take hikes or car rides, just to hike or ride. And when you do, let your mind go into neutral.

Read an array of books – Make a list of books you want to read. Make sure there is a variety—like foods, it's easy to get 'stuck' with a certain genre of reading. Delve into theology, catch the latest leadership release, invest in your marriage or parenting, read biographies of great people, and air out your brain with no-thought novels or mysteries.



As I stated on our network tour, each of those 5 areas of the P.I.E.S.S. naturally drain in ministry. It takes intentionality for us to refill them all for the good of God's Kingdom and those closest to us.


