

One of my fondest memories of growing up in church was when missionaries would come and share their stories of life on the mission field. I distinctly remember those who served in Africa and how many times they would bring with them different artifacts that piqued my interest.

One missionary in particular, Charity Harris, preached a powerful sermon and then, as he began to close the service, brought out a long snakeskin he had killed while living in Tanzania. As he shared, my eyes grew bigger, and I could almost feel like I was there on the hunt with him in person.

Recently, Superintendent Steve Harris' father went home to be with the Lord. His life and legacy will remain in my heart and in the hearts of a multitude of others who were inspired by his example to take the gospel of God's love "To the ends of the earth!" I believe Tanzania has a strong Christian foundation because of the work and ministry of Charity Harris.



Dear hearts, as we start coming out of this pandemic, it is my prayer that we continue to press forward in our mission to "seek and save the lost." May we not grow weary in our priority to reach, teach and send forth laborers into the Master's harvest field.

Brother Harris' passing reminded me of another missionary story I recently read. It's the story of Mary Slessor who grew up in the slums of Aberdeen, Scotland. Sadly, she was raised by an alcoholic father and had little hope of changing her circumstances. But for Mary Slessor, her childhood taught her a tenacity and a strength that would serve her well in her years spent living in Nigeria.



Mary grew up hearing her devout mother read the mission paper every month. In her heart grew a desire to share Jesus with others. She was 27 when David Livingston passed away, and she decided that she would go and continue his work to reach all of Africa. Mary's work began in Calabar, and she lived and worked in places where no European had ever been. She faced life-threatening illness and hardship, but "Mighty Mary" did not once consider giving up. (I love that name: Mighty Mary!)

She lived with the Okoyong and Efik people for 15 years, learning their languages and helping them settle disputes; working tirelessly to educate and overcome superstitions, such as twinkilling and women's rights. She earned their love and respect and as a result was able to spread the gospel to areas no other missionary could. (1848-1915)

I share these stories because I know God is still calling missionaries to take the gospel "To the ends of the earth!" And I firmly believe everyone can pray, give and go. A new season has already sprung forth! The Lord of the harvest is looking for new laborers and it's our turn to say, "Here am I Lord, send me!"

Pastors, I implore you to allow missionaries to share in your pulpits so that the next generation can hear the stories of what God is doing on the field and then prayerfully respond to a missions call. And missionaries, don't forget to bring with you a snakeskin (or any other artifact) because you never know who God has ordained to be in that service, it could even be a little boy named Ron Rockwell.

# WHAT IS THE ACTS 2 JOURNEY COHORT?

The **Acts 2 Journey** Cohort is a yearlong process of discovery, discernment, and development that builds on the strengths of the congregation to learn from the past and envision the future. Church leaders engaged in the cohort will seek God in prayer together as they dream about the future of their churches.

The **Acts 2 Journey** Cohort consists of four weekend retreats over the course of a year.

#### RETREAT



"Why do we exist?" and "Where are we going?"

The team focuses on congregational realities; embraces its mission; and develops the unique, motivating, and guiding vision statement.

#### RETREAT



"How do we achieve our goals?"

The team constructs a strategic plan based on the Acts 2 template: (Connect, Grow, Serve, Go, and Worship).

#### RETREAT



"How should we behave?"

The team discovers the church's individual DNA and the values that will determine how the church utilizes its resources.

#### RETREAT



"Launching the vision"

Each team presents its threeyear strategic plan and receives instruction on practical ways to communicate vision.



#### ACKNOWLEDGE MENTAL & EMOTIONAL NEEDS

"He will not crush the weakest reed or put out a flickering candle." - Isaiah 42:3

Bearing the burdens of others (Gal 6:2), welcoming the weary (Matt 11:28), bearing others' sorrows (Is 53), and walking with others through their doubts (Jude 1:22) are all pictures of the activity of Jesus Himself and His Church.

Most of us are familiar with Christ's Church of the Valley (CCV), which boasts of 32,000 people in attendance each weekend. This powerful church focuses each year on a missions project, but kept their sites on home at the close of 2020. In light of the mental and emotional toll of Covid-19 on people of all ages in the Valley, they initiated the "Press On" campaign to raise funds for the counseling needs of others. Over \$1.8 was initially raised and more continued to pour in. They committed to cover 80% of the counseling costs for 10 sessions with a vetted Christian counselor. For example, our own ordained minister, Penny Rivera's Mesa office has ministered to many people as the result of this great initiative.

Counseling was once held in general disdain in our church circles. Thankfully men like Dr. James Dobson and our own Dr. Richard Dobbins championed the cause of talk therapy within the Church. In 1972, Dr. Dobbins established Emerge Ministries as a faith-based center for mental and emotional health services. I remember as a teenager in the Illinois district, hearing Dr. Dobbins speak and theologically defend the need for such ministry. Decades later we have witnessed the blessing this has been to countless pastors, missionaries, and other leaders in our movement.

As a pastor I prioritized time every week to meet with hurting people under my spiritual care, but also recognized the need at times to refer certain ones to a professionally licensed counselor. I do the same for you in our ministry network, as I maintain a list of Christian counselors that I have vetted as a counseling resource to our ministers. Our elder ministry is step one in this process by their availability to you in times of crisis or just general weariness in ministry. It all points to one truth: as followers of Jesus, we have mental and emotional needs that when met, "fulfill the law of Christ" (Gal 6:2).

#### TIPS FOR MEETING THE MENTAL/EMOTIONAL NEEDS OF YOUR CHURCH:

- Consider a series of messages on related topics. Peter Scazzero is a great resource.
- Allot monies in your church budget to help with the cost of church members needing professional help.
- Do your own personal study on the emotions of God, Jesus His Son, and others in Scripture. It is a fascinating topic!
- Remember our elder ministry is here for you! Just go our AGWM website or phone app and you can explore this great resource for our ministers.
- I am always available to share with you about these and other needs you may have.



Amidst the pandemic, where many things have stopped, God's plan keeps moving forward! For Revolution Church in Tolleson, with Pastor Raul, we see God doing a miracle before our very eyes.

Pastor Theo Nkinzingabo of Hope of Life International, one of our African churches, is reaching many nationalities. Within a 2 mile radius of 43rd Avenue and Northern, there are 79 different languages spoken. Pastor Theo now has an English only service. He has started offering English as a second language classes (ESL), as well as a monthly food give-away where church members build relationship with their multicultural community. The English service is exploding.

It has been a great blessing to meet and encourage many AZAC pastors. Pastors Greg and Kim Ramey, from Praise Center, Picture Rocks, Tucson, have started a second service. Community leaders are now using their church for meetings. The Ramey's thank God for a spiritual vibrancy He is bringing which has invaded their church services. Pastor Gary and Julie Floyd of Foothills Assembly, and Pastor Paula and Kelly Milner of First Assembly of God in Yuma, are adding Spanish services to their churches ministry to have greater impact to reach Yuma.
