Greetings, Network Family! I trust you are staying safe and healthy during this season of COVID-19. Like you, I don't particularly care for some of the adjustments we've had to make during this time of social distancing. For example, everyone's personal grooming is suffering during quarantine. Last week I heard about a couple who were eating dinner together and the wife said to her husband that he had a bit of food caught in his mustache and he replied, "So do you!" (Sorry, I couldn't resist sharing that post I recently saw on Facebook. (a)

This week we received the good news from our World Missions department that all newly appointed and itinerating missionaries would be allowed a three-month extension. Due to the quarantine, our missionaries cannot participate (except online) in church services and are limited in all contact with others, just as we are.

Pastor Steve, Leigh and I realize many churches are experiencing financial shortcomings and are having some difficulty in fulfilling their monthly missions commitments. As a pastor, I understand the constraints on finances and am very sensitive to the needs of all. I stand with both pastor and missionary during this difficult season and assure you, we will get through this together and the Lord will be exalted in every effort to bring the gospel to the world.

### Allow me to share the following guidelines as you navigate through the season of economic downturn:

- Continue to sow in faith, believing God can and often does, make up the difference.
- If needed, try to slow support incrementally and equally.
- Even if you cannot send the full amount or any amount, please do not remove the
  missionary's name from your A/G giving statement. Once removed, they have to make up
  that budget loss by longer itineration periods.
- Trust God to help you start over again with whatever your budget can afford. This might mean \$10, \$20 or \$50 at first, but with God's help, your church can return to your original commitment.

I want to thank you in advance for your prayerful support in these matters and I know that our missionaries greatly appreciate your consideration during these unparalleled times.

As you are aware, is it necessary to hold our Arizona Ministry Network Conference online this year on May 18th. The adjusted format will present a few challenges for our missionaries as this event often generates a sizable boost in funds raised for those newly appointed, as well as those on furlough. Because of these extraordinary circumstances, I'd like to ask every pastor and missions board to consider how they might continue to offer support to all missionaries. I've included a list for your prayerful consideration.

And now may the God of all peace flood you with grace and strength as you continue to do your part to bring the Gospel to the entire world.

I was introduced to the "spirit of a man" or the "human spirit" in my mid-thirties. Oh sure, I was familiar with it, but not in the way a mentor of mine opened it up to me and applied it to myself, my marriage, and relationships. Years later, I discovered the Hebrew of the word "spirit," which furthered solidified this powerful truth.

The word  $r\hat{u}a\dot{h}$  basically means wind or breath, and as well is used for God's Spirit or the human spirit. Its richness is furthered in many lexicons stating it refers to a person's temperament, attitude or frame of mind. The book of proverbs helps us frame a better understanding by stating a person's spirit can be "crushed" "bruised" "broken" "grieved" "happy" "weighed down" "anxious" and actually "ruled". We see Caleb had a "different"  $r\hat{u}a\dot{h}$ , Ahab a "vexed"  $r\hat{u}a\dot{h}$ , Pharoah a "troubled"  $r\hat{u}a\dot{h}$ , and Moses a "bitter"  $r\hat{u}a\dot{h}$ .

As we consider the P.I.E.S.S. for our health (physical, intellectual, emotional, spiritual, and social), we need to pause to capture this meaning in the 127 O.T. verses that reference a person's rûaḥ/spirit. When we do, it helps us pull together what a healthy spirit looks like.


#### Let me give you a few ideas:

- It's healthy when I am aware of my own spirit's condition. The first step to health is awareness. It's why we do screenings and blood work. The same is true with our own spirit. As David asked himself, "Why so downcast O my soul, put your hope in God." It was a moment of self-awareness of his *rûah*.
- It's healthy when I am aware of how others impact it. How else is our spirit broken or crushed? How else is our spirit lifted or encouraged? It's in our rûaḥ/spirit, and people impact ours on a daily, moment-by-moment basis.
- It's healthy when I am aware of how I am impacting others. Think about it! Everyone you interact with on a daily basis has a *rûaḥ*. It may be discouraged and you can bring encouragement. It may be broken, and you can bring healing. It may be anxious and you can bring assurance and peace. God wants us to be sensitive to the spirit of others!
- It's healthy when I focus on the Holy Spirit's communion with my own spirit. Of course, this is the most basic premise of our relationship with God. His Spirit bears witness—touches, confirms, joins with—our spirits. So, as we live out our lives in worship to God, we are celebrating this beautiful Spirit to spirit relationship with Him!



Pastors, consider the health of your spirit (*rûaḥ*) today; not just for your own sake, but for those all around you!.



Your Destiny is not defined in your Adversity! In fact, your Destiny is their Eternity. Pastor Helia Martinez and her husband, Victor, came to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior in the late 90's. Victor was a border patrol agent and Helia was a teacher. With the encouragement of their pastor they started a home Bible study in the home town of San Luis, AZ. Soon the growth of the Bible study, developed into Templo Cristiana Vina Nueva (New Wine Christian Temple). They saw many miracles and the church grew.

Then eight years ago, Victor was told that cancer was in his body. He was elevated into the presence of Jesus after an eight months of fighting. Suddenly the church was without a pastor.

Members of the church gathered with Sister Martinez to ask her to consider becoming the pastor. In her heart she knew that God could help her do it but there seemed to be so many hurdles. The members were so convinced of her call to be the pastor that they formed a caravan and traveled to the Network office from San Luis and asked the Network leadership for the permission to put her into the role. The Network Leadership said, "yes" but told her she needed to get a credential.

The day she went to take the final test, her oldest daughter was involved in a car accident. At the hospital, she was in a quandary ... to take the test for her credential so she could be come the pastor of her church or stay at the hospital while the operated on her daughter. When she told the doctor her quandary, he said, "Go and take the test. I will wait till you are done. Your daughter will be fine." Of course she passed.

Last year she finished her degree in theology at Shiloe Bible College in San Luis Rio Colorado. Now eight years later, the church has grown even more. Because of the impact of their outreaches and a summer VBS they do for immigrant children, Pastora Helia is part of several city committees. She is truly pastoring her city.

No matter what you are facing today, God has a Destiny for you and your church to reach your city for Christ. Do not let your circumstances overwhelm your Destiny. God is with you.
