"Give thanks in all circumstances." 1 Thessalonians 5:18a (NIV)

Have you ever lost your heart of Thanksgiving? Embraced the grim and weary rather than the joy and strength promised as a result of giving thanks?

I read a quote not long ago. Forgive me for not remembering who to give credit to, but this is what it said, "Thanksgiving may not change our situation, but it will always change our soul!"

The Apostle Paul wrote in his final instructions to the Thessalonians to simply give thanks when all things are going well! NO, that is not what he wrote. That would too easy to accomplish. Instead, he adds the bull's eye to his instructions with the phrase, 'in all circumstances, give thanks!'

We know that Jesus' joy is ours for the taking, but often we cannot figure out how to internalize God's joy amidst the drudgery of the daily grind we find ourselves in. We have the mistaken thought that when our circumstances change, joy will be within our grasp.

Here is the danger of not giving thanks in all circumstances. Life becomes drudgery rather than opportunity. We become blind to recognizing the faithfulness of God, even in the glory of answered prayers.

I've used this personal illustration before, but it bears repeating today. Marjorie and I were headed down the road to visit her family in Colorado. Our hearts were loaded down with the cares of this life. Burdens, that at times felt crushing to the soul. We began giving God thanks as we recalled His faithfulness, and the victories we experienced over the years. As we talked, we wept and laughed, as one testimony of the Lord's faithfulness followed another. One memory seemed to spark another.

Gradually, our heart's burdens began to lift, and we traded our sorrows for the joy of giving thanks in all circumstances. It changed our outlook for the future, brought scriptures to mind, and boosted our faith to believe for what looked impossible. As we gave thanks and meditated on the Lord's goodness, our burdens lifted and hope replaced despair. Heaviness was exchanged for freedom. Paul knew the power of giving thanks. It positions us to receive of the bounty from Heaven at God's gracious hand.

I do not have knowledge of what your 'all circumstances' looks like today; however, I can tell you with assurance in my heart that Paul knew the secret of giving thanks in ALL circumstances. His encouragement to give thanks, regardless of circumstances, is foundational to an overcoming life.

In this beautiful season of Thanksgiving, let me encourage you to give thanks in all of your circumstances. The Lord will not fail you. He has heard your prayers, He is doing something about it, and He cares about what concerns you.

Remember, the ultimate hope we have is in Jesus. One thing war and bloodshed do for us as followers of Jesus is leave us longing for a new world - one where there be genuine, eternal peace between us and God and between nations. Praise God, that day is coming. Come, Lord Jesus.

CITY CHURCH - SURPRISE



City Church meets in Surprise, AZ at Ottawa University in their Faith Arena. The church was planted in June of 2016 with 27 people. Pastor Russ Smith & his wife, Traci have over 30 years of credentialed ministry experience including: Youth Pastor of 250 and Executive Pastor of 3500. They could not seem to grow City Church past 125-150. They came out of COVID with only 33 people. Pastor Russ & Traci prayed, fasted, and never gave up. At the beginning of 2023, they had 69 people, including children.

In July, Pastor Russ & Traci attended the AZ CMN Retreat with Mike Santiago from Break200 Ministry. They jumped in 100% with following the steps provided through the Break200 strategy. City Church now has an average attendance of over 200! They have had 27 first-time decisions for Christ, 21 water baptisms, and 8 baptized in the Holy Spirit!

City Church expects that now, they have broken 200 permanently by taking the very scalable systems of Break200 and watching them work!

What a great time of worship and fellowship we had at last week's Ministers Renewal! Pastor Raul Salgado opened his new building and worship team to us and our guest speaker, Greg Ford, brought timely words in all three sessions. His final session though, ministered the most to me and was something I have never heard spoken about as he did.

A reoccurring theme in recent conversations with pastors has been the hurts that ministry brings. Not subtle and occasional, but more the overt and oft-repeated hurts that ministry provides. It reminds me of a conversation I had playing golf with a layman a few weeks ago. He has a son in ministry and along a similar vein he said to me, "You would think the safest, most enjoyable type of work in all the world would be pastoring Christians!" There was a sad humor to his tone.

Greg Ford's final session was a challenge to pastors to go back and "listen to your own messages!" He gave several examples of how months or even years later, God has used his own sermons to speak to and encourage his heart. It was a revolutionary thought! I have reflected much on this over the past few days.

Pastors, I would encourage you to not only try this, but possibly make it a spiritual discipline. Like myself, you have probably used your past sermons in counseling settings or other conversations, but have you ever let the Holy Spirit speak to you directly from one of your own sermons? It's really a quite logical way for God to encourage, challenge, and heal us over our seasons of ministry.

I'd encourage you to listen/watch the Tuesday afternoon session of the Renewal when it is posted on our website/phone app. It will bless you.

Thank you for all you do and we will continue to pray for you and your ministries.


