He is truly the Savior of the world, and I am so grateful He is mine.

Acts 26:17-18 says, "I am sending you to them to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me."

This scripture has never rung truer than it does today. More people on planet Earth are living in spiritually dark and unreached areas than ever before in human history. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. - Hebrews 10:24-25

Many of you attended the Equipping Day with Dr. Linda Seiler in July. What an amazing and timely presentation! She is a true gift to our A/G fellowship and the Church at large today. Her testimony of her deliverance from gender confusion and same-sex attraction, and many resources are available at https://lindaseiler.com.

I was struck by two major themes that wove throughout her personal testimony and that of the many others she referenced that have been delivered from homosexuality and other aspects of the LBGTQ culture. Her dissertation research for her PhD involved 30 individuals who share a similar testimony and each of them lived these themes: the power of the Holy Spirit and the need for community.

We all would agree both are essential to an overcoming Christian life and most likely, we have mentioned each in recent sermons we have preached. Yet, I would like to focus in on the second one in this brief writing and ask you to conduct a personal introspection. Living in community can be challenging in the pastorate. Some adhere to a strict avoidance of any deep relationships while others freely enjoy close friendships within their church community (as Carla and I have through the years). Yet, many a pastor admits to a sense of loneliness and isolation in ministry.


Whatever your approach to leadership, one way to meet this need is through relationship with other pastors. Yes, you heard me correctly, **relationship with other pastors!** This might seem even more frightful than befriending our sheep, but if anyone understands the needs, struggles, and spiritual warfare of the pastorate it is a fellow shepherd of God's flock.

We are about to begin our 7th session of weekly Pastors' Zoom calls. Quite honestly, these have become a highlight for me as I get to weekly spend time with several groups of pastors. We meet for one hour, discuss one chapter from a good book, and simply **grow together**. The greatest benefit though is just hanging out with other likeminded pastors. In a few weeks we will start another 12 weeks in three different books, including a marriage book for couples. Pastors, you are awesome. Our network leadership loves you and believes in you. We also believe that we do our best ministry in community with one another!




